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

Curriculum Days

Year 1

On Tuesday 7th February we had our curriculum day for Science'All about our Senses'. The children brought in blindfolds



and wore them for most of the day to complete different activities. In English we learnt about Guide Dogs and spoke about the use of Braille - the children then made their names in Braille using gems. In Maths the children completed different addition and subtraction questions blindfolded using manipulatives such as cubes, dienes and bead strings. Then in the



afternoon the children completed obstacle courses in pairs (one child giving instructions and the other wearing a blindfold), going through hoops, catching bean bags and walking along benches. We also played games such as Chinese Whispers and finding the keys. The children absolutely loved it!

Easter Service -Wednesday 29th March

The Easter Service will be Wednesday 29th held on March at 10.15 am at St Michael & All Angels Church in Warwick Road. The Year 5 children will present the service, retelling the Easter Story through drama and readings. We are very much looking forward to being able to hold our Services in person again. Children in all year groups will walk to the church to attend the service and parents and families are warmly invited to join us at this celebration. We look forward to seeing many of you there.



Car Parking

We do realise that parking is difficult outside the school and we ask that parents park considerately both in the morning and after school to ensure the safety of our children and out of respect to our local residents.

Please avoid parking on the corner of Maxwell Road and Garvin Avenue as this makes it difficult for our children to see to cross the road safely, and across the drives of our local residents' houses.

Also we ask that you do not park in front of the school gates at any time during the school day to drop children off. This poses several problems ranging from a danger to children who have to walk behind a car that may be reversing, to deliveries and visitors being unable to enter the school's car park, which in turn blocks Maxwell Road. This access point must be kept clear in case of a emergency. Cars should not be parked on the zigzags outside the school as this obstructs the view of children trying to cross the road.

As part of the school's travel plan we would encourage parents and children to walk to school when ever possible. On the occasions when you must use a car we suggest you park away from the school. (along Caledon Road and One Tree Lane and walk across the footbridge to school or park in the Sainsbury's Car Park on the top level.) Sainsbury's have kindly agreed to allow our parents to park from 8.30 - 9.15 am and 3.00 - 3.45 pm on the top level of the Sainsbury Car Park.

We ask that you please support these important safety guidelines.

PTA Easter Fair -Friday 24th March 3.30-5.30pm


In preparation for the Easter Fair, we will be holding a Mufti Day
