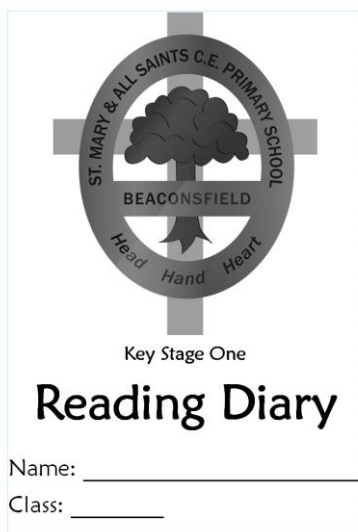


Recording reading- KS1

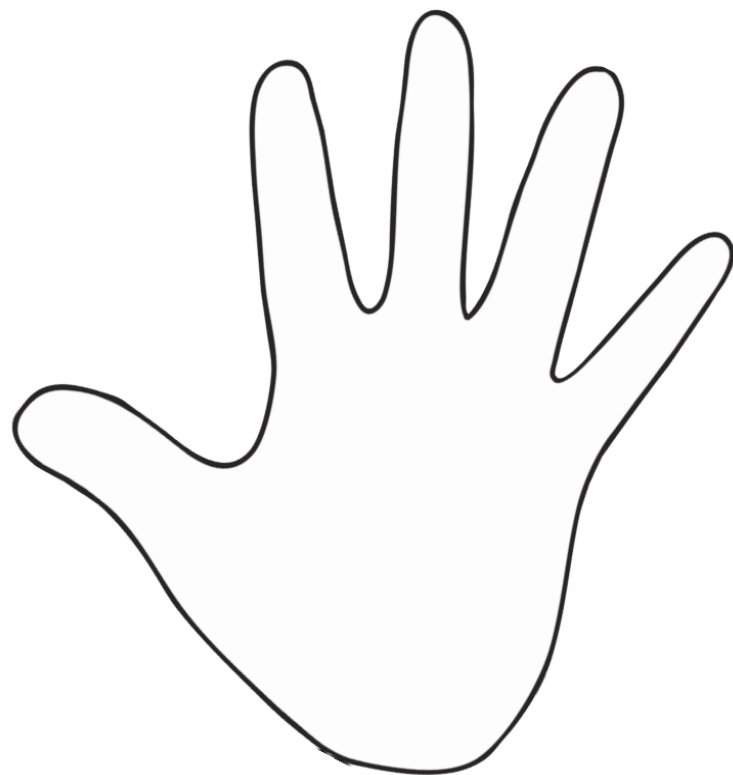
I will:

- uphold the school values of Wisdom, Creativity and Love.

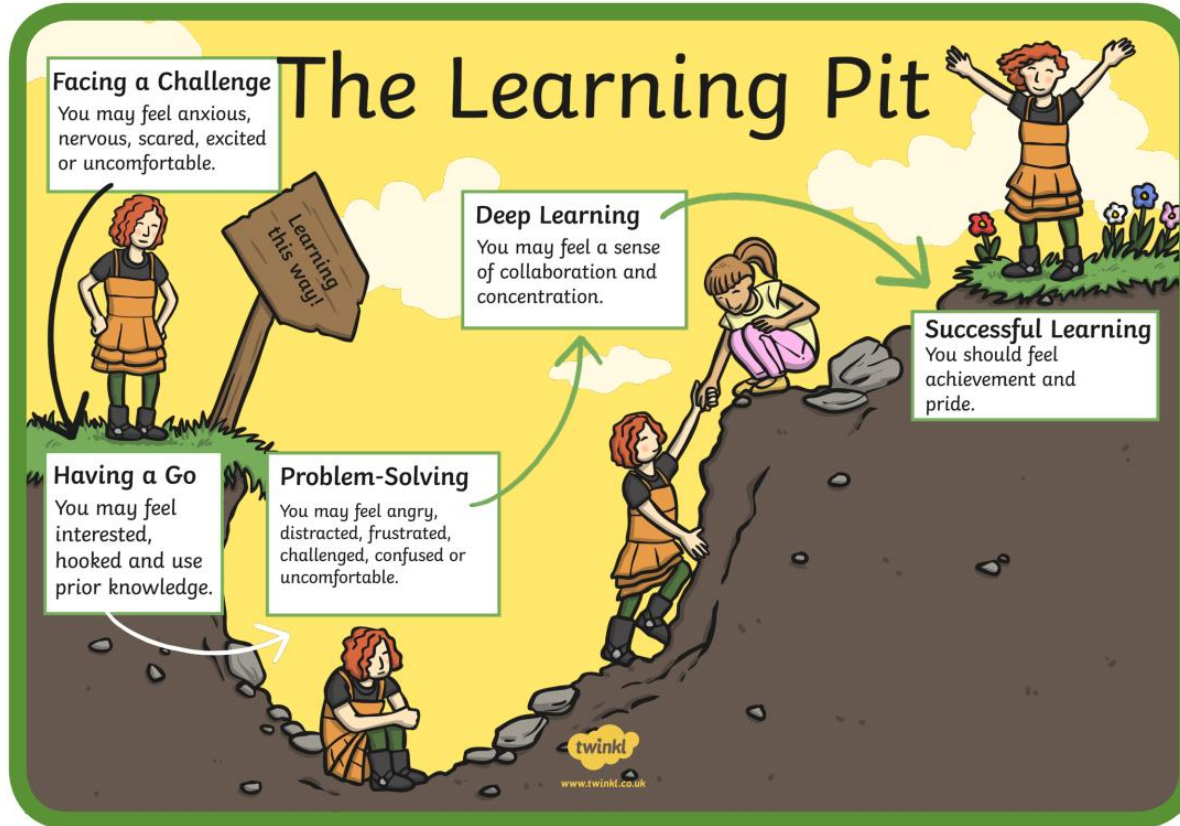
